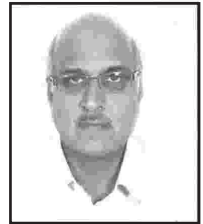

Evolution of Mobility India

It began in the early 90's...

Action on Disability and Development (ADD) an UK based charity established an Indian NGO named Action on Disability and Development - India (ADD India) to empower disabled people. After a few years of work they realized it was difficult to empower people without rehabilitation services. Many people could not come out of their huts or houses due to lack of rehabilitation services especially mobility devices.

Observing the huge need of rehabilitation services in rural India, ADD UK sent expatriate Mr. Kevan Moll, to support grass-root organizations to promote rehabilitation services. He started work in the name of ADD Mobility. Soon, it was evident that there was a need to establish a local non-governmental organization to be fully operated by Indians, and a person to lead.

Kevan shared his thoughts with Gautam, Chapal's long term friend. Subsequently Balakrishna Venkatesh (then ADD-India Director) and Chris Underhill (ADD-UK Director) approached Chapal to take up this initiative in Southern part of India.



Mr Chapal Khasnabis then was heading the department of Prosthetics and Orthotics in National Institute for the Orthopaedically Handicapped (NIOH), Kolkata and also used to do volunteer services for few charities at Kolkata. During the course of his work he tried to do many things for the benefit of people with disabilities.

"I saw the poor suffer and realized that most people for whom we should work are not able to

access the services. I realized that I need to look for a place where I could realize my dream and belief and with my abilities I wanted to do something for the poorest of the poor - "people with disabilities and their families".

Several meetings took place between Gautam, Chapal and Kevan to discuss the creation and future of Mobility India. The culmination of four years work of ADD Mobility emerged as an Indian NGO - **MOBILITY INDIA**. Kevan facilitated this process and found the members to set up Mobility India and Chapal became its Executive Director.

Taking Mobility India forward....

On 2nd August 1994, Mobility India was established with Mr. Chapal Khasnabis and Ms. Albina Shankar. Within a short span of his work, Chapal observed the tremendous need and urgency for spreading rehabilitation services across rural India. To realise this he also understood the MI needs to change its objectives and start a resource centre to enhance its capacity. Along with founder President Late Sunder Egbert; he drew the plan for future activities.



Milestones - 15 years...

1994

- 2nd August 1994, Mobility India (MI) was established in a small office within the premises of Association of People with Disability.



- The initial support for operations came from Action on Disability & Development (ADD) UK and Action Aid. The organization started with 5 lakhs budget. Mobility India started working with 9 rural organizations (partners) in Southern India for technical support.

1995

- **Training:** Numerous short term workshops on Prosthetics and Orthotics were conducted, such

as making of body braces, special seats, standing frames and toilet seats for children with cerebral palsy and multiple disabilities.



- An Orthotics workshop was set up in one of our partners CRDA, Coimbatore
- **Networking:** Developed ties with ISRO/ISAC, DEBEL, ALIMCO and Rajiv Gandhi Foundation
- **Research:** In collaboration with International Centre for Advancement of Community Based Rehabilitation (ICACBR), Canada for in making light weight plastic callipers suitable for rural conditions and more user-friendly to children.
- **Funders:** MIBLOU, Misereor-Germany, Stichting Kinderpostzegels Netherlands (SKN), European Community Block Grant, Edgeworth India Trust.

1996

- The office shifted to a larger space within the APD campus. The staff increased to 5 and programmes expanded.
- Communication & local fund raising unit was established.
- Mobility India's Logo was created.

- **Mobile workshop** was launched to take rehabilitation services to remote areas for people at their doorstep. It is an effective alternative means of making facilities available in the villages.



- Registration under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act was obtained.
- The unique "Rehabilitation Aid cooperative



workshop by women with disabilities" project begun by training ten women with disabilities as Orthotic technicians.

- In association with Defence Bio-engineering and Electromedical Laboratory (DEBEL) first design of an orthotic knee joint was developed that was low cost, light in weight and suitable for rural conditions



- Relationship with Jaipur Limb Campaign (JLC) presently known as Disability and Development Partners was begun.



Milestones - 15 years...

1997

- Rehabilitation Aids workshop by women with disabilities (RAWWD), Bangalore was established on 10th August after the completion of the training of 10 women technicians.



- The first fund raising event “Climbing the Utility Building in Mahatma Gandhi Road, Bangalore was organised in association with CRY and HELP AGE India, Bangalore on 15th August.
- The evaluation of Mobility India's activities for 1995-1997 was done by Dr. Maya Thomas and Dr. M.J. Thomas.
- Workshop in collaboration with Indo-Can Orthopaedics, Canada on endo-skeletal above knee prostheses was organised- first time exposure for professionals in India.



- Undertook joint research on “Bare foot orthosis with unilock” and “Development of endoskeletal prosthesis” in collaboration with Defence Bio-engineering and Electro medical Laboratory (DEBEL).



1998

- Started its therapy service with the support of Meriel Norris, Physiotherapist, VSO Volunteer.
- Four educational movies on management of poliomyelitis were made by Handicap International in association with Mobility India.
- 1st September, Mobility India's Regional Centre was started in Kolkatta, West Bengal to work with organisations in Eastern

and North Eastern India. Dorabji Tata Trust came forward to support us along with SKN

- The manual on Plastic Uni-Lock and Barefoot Orthosis was designed and printed.
- In Partners' Meet held in October, members expressed the need of training personnel in rehabilitation.



- Mobility India planned to set up a Research Rehabilitation and Training Centre.

Bangalore Development Authority (BDA) allotted a C A Site. Mr. and Mrs. Sundar Thomas played a key role in the entire process.

- 14 young persons with disability were trained as activists for social change. Community Based Rehabilitation was initiated in 5 urban slums of Bangalore.



- Mobility India started its relationship with new donors like Christoffel Blindenmission (CBM) and Handicap International.

1999

- Mobility India moved to a temporary office in Jayanagar closer to the land.



- Foundation stone for Mobility India Rehabilitation Research and Training Centre was laid by our Patron, Sri Khurshed Alam Khan, Governor of Karnataka.

- An International seminar organised on the Management of Polio in collaboration with International Society for Prosthetics & Orthotics to bring medical and paramedical professionals as well as CBR workers together.



Milestones - 15 years...

- Developed and introduced prosthetic free knee joint for above knee Jaipur type artificial limb. Developed a Jaipur foot which could be used in the endoskeletal system.
- Set up a small Prosthetics and Orthotics workshop with basic therapy facility to provide direct services.



2000



- 5 year Business Plan was prepared with the support of a Management Consultant from UK.

- A unique service for wheelchair users was introduced - Accessible Mobile Taxi Service and wheelchair bank for rentals.



- Website was launched.

2001

- Mobility India expanded its CBR programme area to cover 15 slums in Banashankari.
- Many workshops were organized to train staff as trainers and initiative was taken to develop curriculum for P&O, CBR and therapy courses.



2002

- Orthotics and Prosthetics Society of India national Conference was organised, 450 professionals participated. The video on "Making of Jaipur Foot" was launched at the conference.



Milestones - 15 years...



- 6th April remarkable day in the history of Mobility India - Moved into the newly constructed disabled friendly Millennium Building. **This was possible because of many donors support and trust.**



- 15th April - First training programme commenced on Community Based Rehabilitation for community workers.

- 1st July - One year training programme in Lower Limb Prosthetics and Orthotics and Rehabilitation Therapy was commenced.



- Jaipur Foot Production unit was set up. It is one of the most accessible and modern production centre managed exclusively by women with disabilities.



- The Prosthetics & Orthotics workshop and therapy facilities increased the access to services for more number of people with disabilities.



- Mobility India Staff Welfare Association (MISWA) was formed for the welfare of the staff.

- Mobility India launched pre-fabricated knee ankle foot Orthosis (PFKAFO) after many long years of research. The Orthosis could be used extensively in India and other low-income countries for millions of people who are in need of it.



2003

- On 23rd September, Below Knee Prosthetic Plastic Modular Component (SATHI) was launched.

- Second evaluation of Mobility India was conducted for 1998-2003 by Dr Mani, Ms Christy Abraham and Mr Ajit Dalal .

2004

- Mr. Chapal Khasnabis joined World Health Organisation, Geneva and Mr. Michael Sanjivi was appointed as Director.



- Founder President Mr. Sundar Egbert passed away MI lost one of its most eminent person. Dr. Umashankar became the President.

- Abilis foundation, Finland selected MI as its facilitating agency in India, to support grass root organisations for the empowerment and livelihood of people with disabilities.



- Long term training programme was evaluated to improve its quality.



- Mobility India's Regional Centre started outreach programme in Garden Reach area and set up orthopaedic workshop in North-East.

2005

- Partnership with Motivation, UK to improve the service provision of wheelchairs begun.
- International Committee of the Red Cross-special fund for disabled started its support.

- Rehabilitation Council of India awarded recognition for Rehabilitation Therapy Assistant course.

- PFKAFO technology was transferred in Ethiopia through Hands on workshop.



2006

- International Society of Prosthetics and Orthotics (ISPO) President Mr. Harold Shangali & its consultant Dr Steen J. Jensen evaluated the long term training programmes.

- 3 weeks course on wheelchair service provision in collaboration with Motivation, UK was commenced.

- Mr Michael Sanjivi left the services and Albina became the Acting Director.

- MI hosted an International consensus conference on wheelchairs for developing countries was organised by USAID, WHO and ISPO.



- A challenging and an ambitious project was initiated - **Education and Livelihood Opportunities** at Chamrajnagar District, Karnataka.



- Dr. Elizabeth Thomas became the President.

2007

- Mrs. Albina Shankar took over as the Director of Mobility India.
- On 14th January, Education and Livelihood Opportunities Project Office was inaugurated in Chamrajnagar District, Karnataka.
- Received recognition for its training programme by ISPO- the only school in India.
- Research activities expanded in the development of machines and equipment.

- CBR programme in Anekal taluk, Bangalore District begun and it is the first time MI received support from CBM AUSAID.



- Bachelors degree programme - 4 and ½ years affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences and recognised by Rehabilitation Council of India commenced on 16th October.



- A workshop on 'Validation of the WHO CBR Guidelines' organized by WHO, Rehabilitation Council of India. and Leonard Cheshire International was hosted.

- PFKAFO technology was transferred to Tanzania.
